Winter Break Workshops

On Thursday, January 2, and Friday January 3, Jones County 4-H and Craven County 4-H will be joining forces to conduct training for teens interested in teaching Health Rocks! Health Rocks is 4-H's substance abuse prevention curriculum. It is a great curriculum that provides teens with the tools to effectively spread the message on the dangers of tobacco, drugs, and alcohol. To be trained teens must agree to attend the full ten-hour workshop, which will be split between the two days. The training will be five hours long on each day and participants must be able to attend both days. There will be giveaways, and lots of fun to be had during this training. This is great leadership training for teens looking to develop their leadership skills, and aid in the mission to prevent substance abuse.

Mike's Farm Trip

The annual 4-H trip to Mike's Farm will be taking place on Wednesday, December 18. We have reservations for 4pm; therefore we will be meeting here at the Jones County Extension Office at 3:00pm. The prices for 4-H members and volunteers are: 12 - adult - \$16.00, youth 7-11 - \$11, youth 5-6 \$8. This price includes your meal, taxes, gratuity, and hayride. This is a discounted price, as Jones Co. 4-H will cover the rest of the cost. Please remember to dress in layers on this trip as the restaurant can be on the warm side, and the hayride is an outside, nighttime activity! Feel free to bring blankets and such for the hayride. Any 4-Her interested in going on this trip needs to register by paying their fee by 5pm on Friday, December 6, as I will have to confirm my numbers with Mike's Farm!

Fund Raisers

The wreaths are sold by taking orders now through November 13. Each wreath cost \$20 and for each wreath sold, the 4-Her will receive 8 "cloverbucks". The wreaths are nice Frazer Fir Christmas Wreaths that will be available for pick up at the Extension Office on December 4.

Competitions

The start of the New Year also means the start of another year of various competitions 4-Hers can be involved in. Upcoming competitions include: Horse Bowl, Hippology, Horticulture Judging, Livestock Judging, WHEP, Forestry Judging, Photography, among many others. If anyone is interested in learning more about these competitions, please let me know.

On January 21, I will be having the first 4-H WHEP (Wildlife Habitat Evaluation Program) practice. The purpose of the competition is to promote wildlife management practices. Youth interested in wildlife, safe hunting practices, nature, etc. are strongly encouraged to attend this session. This practice will take place from 1pm – 3pm at the Extension Office.

In addition to WHEP I will be conducting a practice session for a Jones County Envirothon team. Each county can have a middle and high school team. The regional Envirothon competition will be held on Tuesday, March 18, in New Bern. Envirothon is similar to WHEP, but not quite as intense.

4-H Camp

Currently 4-H camp is in a transition period. We have yet to hear which week we will be going to camp next year. As soon as I hear something I will let everyone know. I know all who went to camp this past year, would like to go back next year. So as I get the details I will get them to you!
